weaving with rattan reed for 16 years and teaching for 13 years. Eight years ago Phyllis was introduced to birch bark and found a new excitement working with this beautiful, leather-like bark. She has knowledge of Scandinavian basket weaving among other weaving styles and has taught at the annual Heikinpaiva Mid-Winter Festival at Hancock, Michigan; John C. Campbell Folk School at Brasstown, NC; North House Folk School at Grand Marais, MN; plus numerous basket weaving

guilds; and community education classes. Phyllis's baskets are sold at many art shows and galleries in this area.









ELEVATOR ADDITION BLUEPRINTS

Everyone enjoyed learning about flint-knapping from our August speaker, Tom Lind. It is reported to have been our best program ever. Thank you, Tom.


The building addition is moving along smoothly and quickly to beat the coming cold weather. The workers are enjoying the photography of their labor and we have a daily record of the project.
